





DIBRUGARH UNIVERSITY : AN OVERVIEW

Dibrugarh University was established in 1965 under the provisions of the Dibrugarh University Act, 1965 enacted by the Assam Legislative Assembly. This affiliating institution of higher learning with residential facilities was conceived and planned for augmenting skilled human resources for developing and exploiting the rich biodiversity and mineral wealth of the region. The University is situated at Rajabheta at a distance of about five kilometers to the South of the premier town of Dibrugarh in the easternmost corner of Assam as well as India. Dibrugarh, a commercially and industrially advanced town in the entire north-eastern region, also enjoys a unique place in the fields of art, literature and culture. The district of Dibrugarh is well known for its vast treasure of minerals (including oil, natural gas and coal), flora and fauna and largest concentration of tea plantation. The diverse tribes with their distinct dialects, customs, traditions and culture also make this area a variable paradise for the Anthropological and Sociological studies besides Art and Culture. The Dibrugarh University Campus is well linked by roads, rails, air and waterways.



- ▶ The National Highway No.37 passes through the University Campus.
- ▶ The University Campus extends over an area of more than 500 acres of which 60 acres are still covered under tea plantation.
- ▶ Dibrugarh University is a member of the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) and the Association of Commonwealth Universities (ACU). The Degrees conferred by this University are recognized by all the Universities in India and abroad on reciprocal basis.
- ▶ The university is re-accredited by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) with 'A' grade.

ACADEMIC SCENARIO

The University through the various Academic Departments, Centre for Studies in its campus and the affiliated Colleges scattered over the nine districts is imparting higher education in the various branches of learning in Arts including Performing Arts, Commerce, Engineering, Medical, Pharmaceutical Sciences, Law, Science & Technology, Computer Sciences, Management, Journalism and Mass Communication, Teachers' Training etc. There are 18 Departments and 17 Centres for Studies offering different academic programmes in Science, Technology, Commerce, Management, Pharmaceutical Sciences and Education leading to the B.A. B.Ed., B. Pharm., BBA, BCA, BA. LLB., B.Sc.(IT) LLB, B.Lib.I.Sc., M.A., M.Sc., M.Tech., M.Com., MBA, MCA, M. Pharm., M.Ed., M.Lib.I.Sc., M.Phil., PhD. and Post Doctoral degrees. Some of these Departments/Centres also conduct Post Graduate Diploma, Certificate Programmes like the 2 year Integrated Diploma Course in Tai Language; Certificate Courses in Computer Application; Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Application, Bio-Informatics, Finance and Marketing, Actuarial Science, Rural Development, Tea Technology and Plantation Management, Journalism and Mass Communication etc. All the Academic Departments and the Centres of the University are under umbrella of seven Faculty of Studies i.e., Faculty of Science and Engineering with 36 academic programmes; Faculty of Humanities and Law with 20 academic programmes, Faculty of Social Sciences with 19 academic programmes; Faculty of Education with 11 academic programmes; Faculty of Commerce and Management Science with 10 academic programmes; Faculty of Biological Science with 7 academic programmes and Faculty of Earth Science and Energy with 8 academic programmes. Besides, teaching the above mentioned courses, the University offers Undergraduate Programmes (B.A./B.Com/BCA) and Postgraduate Programmes (M.A./M.Sc./M.Com.) under Directorate Open and Distance Learning (DODL), Dibrugarh University.



CENTRAL LIBRARY

There is a Central Library (rechristened as Lakshminath Bezboroa Library) in the University with a present holding of approx. 2,25,000 including books and rare publications, 22,685 back volumes of journals, 5,000 thesis and dissertations, besides reference books numbering 11,834 in Science, Arts and Humanities and Commerce subjects, 143 nos. of research journals published in India and abroad.

The individual Teaching Departments also have their own Departmental Libraries. A few Departments also maintain their Documentation Centres. The Learners of distance education programmes may enroll themselves in the library paying the prescribed fees.

AUDITORIUM

"Rang-Ghar", the fully Air-conditioned auditorium of Dibrugarh University has a capacity of 1200. Cultural programmes and other meets take place there throughout the year. The University has also a well-equipped Conference Hall with all modern in-built facilities.

BISHNU RABHA RANGA MANCHA

In addition to Rang-Ghar, there is an open Auditorium named "Bishnu Rabha Ranga Mancha" which has a capacity of 4000 audience for any events.

HEALTH CENTRE

The University has a Health Centre with requisite number of Doctors, Nurses and Pharmacist. There is an Ambulance Service. The Health Centre operates 24 hours x 7 days a week.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The University provides various facilities for the co-curricular activities, like Gymnasium, Indoor Stadium, Outdoor Stadium etc. The DODL learners can take part in the "Varsity Week" which is held annually and Inter-collage championship as per rule.





DIRECTORATE OF OPEN & DISTANCE LEARNING

During the last two decades it has been observed that most of the departments of the University received a large number of applications for admission into the M.A./M.Sc./M.Com. To help a number of Learners who due to limited number of seats in post-graduate classes or for other reasons could not enroll themselves as Learners of the University, the 73rd meeting of the Academic Council vide Resolution No. 5 held on 2nd September 2000 decided to introduce Distance Education in the University. This would provide an opportunity to the Learners who could not enroll themselves as Learners of the University to obtain a post-graduate degree through the mode of distance education. The degree shall have the same standard and status as the post graduate degree of the regular Learners under Semester System.

Dibrugarh University has decided to introduce Semester System in its undergraduate (B.A./B. Sc./B. Com) programmes from the academic session 2011-12. Introduction of Semester System in the undergraduate level would limit the number of Learners enrolled to these programmes, as semester system demand a high student-teacher ratio. In order to create an opportunity to those Learners who would not be able to enroll themselves in the regular B.A./B.Sc./B.Com Programmes in the college, Dibrugarh University has already introduced the Bachelor of Arts (B. A.) Programme in the Annual system through distance mode from the academic year 2011-2012. Keeping with the same spirit, the Directorate has decided to introduce Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.) Programme and B.A. Hons. in Assamese, Economics, Political Science and Sociology, in Annual System (Three year degree programme) through Open and Distance Learning mode from the academic session 2012-2013. From Academic Session 2020-21, the Directorate has introduced Under Graduate Programmes (B.A. General/B.A. Hons./B.Com/BCA) and Post Graduate Programmes (M.A./M.Sc./M.Com.) in Semester System.

VISION

The Directorate of Open and Distance Learning, Dibrugarh University has a vision to reach the unreached by imparting quality education.

The primary purpose of the Directorate of Open and Distance Learning, Dibrugarh University (DODL, D. U.) is to maximize student access to Programmes through the use of a vast network of Study Centers/Learner Support Centers (LSCs) spread across the nine districts of Upper Assam. The Directorate supports the Dibrugarh University's mission and its strategic plan by enhancing student learning and success.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

- The Directorate started its mission with Post Graduate Programmes in Assamese, Commerce, History, Economics, Mathematics, Political Science and Sociology since 2001 through its 36 Study Centres.
- MA in English Programme has been introduced from the academic session 2008-09.
- Bachelor in Business Administration (BBA), Bachelor in Computer Application (BCA) has been launched from the academic session 2010-11.
- The Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) Programme in Annual System through Distance Mode has been initiated from the academic session 2011- 2012.
- Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.) and BA Major (renamed as Hons.) in Assamese, Economics, Political Science and Sociology in annual system through Distance Mode was introduced from the academic session 2012-13.
- Minor Research Projects related to various fields of Distance Education have been initiated.
- From Academic Session 2020-21, the Directorate has introduced Under Graduate Programmes (B.A. General/B.A. Hons./B.Com/BCA) and Post Graduate Programmes (M.A./M.Sc./M.Com.) under Semester Mode.

The Directorate of Open and Distance Learning, Dibrugarh University has so far successfully sustained its mission to expand through a network of Study Centres/ Learner Support Centres (LSCs) under the territorial jurisdiction of Dibrugarh University. At present it has 99 numbers of Study Centres/ Learner Support Centres (LSCs).

THE DODL LIBRARY

The DODL Library was established in the year 2013 in the New Building of DODL, D.U. It has a collection of more than 6500 books regarding different subjects like Assamese, Commerce & Management, Computer Science & Information Technology, Economics, Education, English, History, Law, Library & Information Science, Journalism & Mass Communications, Mathematics, Philosophy, Political Science, Public Administration, Research Methodology, Sociology etc. It has also collection of Dictionaries, Geographical Guidebooks, Encyclopedias, Employment News, magazines like Frontline, North East Today, Competition Success, Protiyogita Kiran, Careers 360 etc. The users of DODL Library are mostly the Distance Learners. The daily visit of the learners in using the Library resources is 25-30. The Library is opened from 10.00 A.M. to 5.00 P.M. for the learners. The library is fully computerized with SOUL 2.0 integrated library management software (ILMS).

HOW TO APPLY

ADMISSION PROCEDURES AND REQUIREMENTS TO UNDER GRADUATE (UG) PROGRAMMES:

Application for admission into B.A. (General) / B.A. (Hons.)/ B.Com. programme are invited in the month of February/March, 2021 for the Academic Session 2020-21. Candidates are to apply in prescribed format only. Application form along with the prospectus can be obtained from any of the Study Centres/ LSCs under the Directorate of Open and Distance Learning, Dibrugarh University. For admission into an Under Graduate Programme, a student has to deposit admission fees at Punjab National Bank, Dibrugarh University Branch (RTGS/NEFT IFS Code: PUNB0994000) and State Bank of India, Dibrugarh University Branch (IFS Code No. SBIN0002051) in favour of Distance Education Fund, Dibrugarh University.

The application must be accompanied by attested copies of the Marksheet and testimonials listed below:

- ▶ Self-attested copy of the H.S.L.C. Examination Marksheet and Pass Certificate.
- ▶ Self-attested copy of the HSSLC (10+2) Examination Marksheet and Pass Certificate.
- ▶ One copy of recent passport size photograph signed by the candidate on the back side and one copy of stamp size photograph.
- ▶ Self-attested copy of D.U. Registration Card (if already registered).
- ▶ Govt. Identifier (PAN, AADHAR, Voter ID, Ration Card, Driving License)



ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- ▶ Those Learners who have applied for admission and fulfill the essential qualifications are eligible to take admission into the concerned disciplines.
- ▶ Eligible candidates are required to deposit the admission fee in the study centre by Cash/Bank Draft/Debit Card.
- ▶ On receipt of the admission fee candidates will be admitted into the Programme.

ADMISSION PROCEDURES AND REQUIREMENTS TO POSTGRADUATE (PG) PROGRAMMES:

Application for admission into M.A., M.A./M.Sc. (Mathematics) and M.Com. Programme are invited in the month of February/March, 2021 for the Academic Session 2020-21.

The prospectus can be obtained from any of the Study Centres/ LSCs under the Directorate of Open and Distance Learning, Dibrugarh University. For admission into a Post Graduate Programme, a student have to deposit admission fees at Punjab National Bank, Dibrugarh University Branch (RTGS/NEFT IFS Code: PUNB0994000) and State Bank of India, Dibrugarh University Branch (IFS Code No. SBIN0002051) in favour of Distance Education Fund, Dibrugarh University.

The application must be accompanied by attested copies of the marksheets and other testimonials listed below or transcript issued by the University from which the candidate has graduated.

- ▶ Attested copy of the H.S.L.C. Examination Marksheet and Pass Certificate.
- ▶ Attested copy of the H.S.S.L.C. (10+2) Examination Marksheet and Pass Certificate.
- ▶ Attested copy of the B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. Marksheet and Pass Certificate.
- ▶ Attested copy of the University Registration Certificate. (For applicants from Dibrugarh University)
- ▶ Candidates from Universities other than Dibrugarh University must get themselves registered to Dibrugarh University. For this purpose, they should contact the
- ▶ Co-ordinator of the Study Centre in which they have enrolled.
- ▶ One copy of recent passport size photograph signed by the candidate on the back side and one copy of stamp size photograph.
- ▶ Govt. Identifier (PAN, AADHAR, Voter ID, Ration Card, Driving License)

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- ▶ Eligible candidates are required to deposit the admission fee in the form of cash/a drawn in favour of "Distance Education Fund, D.U." payable at Punjab National Bank, Dibrugarh University Branch (RTGS/NEFT IFS Code : PUNB0994000) or State Bank of India, Dibrugarh University Branch (IFS Code No. SBIN0002051) in favour of Distance Education Fund, Dibrugarh University.
- ▶ On receipt of the admission fee candidates will be provisionally admitted into the course.
- ▶ Provisionally admitted Learners shall have to produce the transcript issued by the institution last attended or the original mark sheets and other testimonials for verification at the office of the DODL, D.U. at the time of their first personal contact programme.
- ▶ On production of transcript/original mark sheet and other testimonials their admission to the DODL, D.U. will be confirmed.
- ▶ The entire admission process could be completed by correspondence except the production of transcript/ original mark sheet and other testimonials. Candidates are advised not to send original mark sheets etc. by post.



IDENTITY CARD

On confirmation of admission, the Learners will be issued Identity Cards by the concerned Study Centre.

NOTE: Learners are advised to carry their Identity Cards whenever they visit the Study Centre or the DODL, D.U. and also for attending the Personal Contact Programme(s).

DODL, UNIQUE IDENTITY (UID) NUMBER

Learners admitted shall be issued Unique Identity (UID) Number which will be intimated to them. Learners are advised to quote their Unique Identity (UID) Number in all the correspondences with DODL, D.U.

REFUSAL OF ADMISSION

Notwithstanding any rules and procedures, a student may be refused admission if his/her past conduct in the educational institution last attended has not been satisfactory. A student who has been expelled/ rusticated or disqualified by the University may also be denied admission.

CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION

Admission of a student can be cancelled at any stage if it is found that he/she has furnished incorrect information or has suppressed facts to secure admission. If any dispute arises out of such refusal/cancellation, the decision of the Vice-Chancellor, D.U. shall be final.

WITHDRAWAL OF ADMISSION

In case of any withdrawal, the refund of fee to the learners will be based on the UGC notification on "Remittance and Refund of Fees and other Student Centric Issues" which was approved by the commission in its 519th Meeting held on 15th November, 2016.

DELIVERY OF STUDY MATERIALS

Learners who get admitted in any of the Study Centres permitted by the Directorate of Open and Distance Learning, D.U. shall be supplied with the following materials at the respective Study Centres:

- ▶ A complete set of study materials of the programme will be supplied to the Learners within a month of the last date of admission by the Study Centres/ LSCs.

SYLLABUS AND REGULATIONS

Syllabus and Regulations for all UG & PG Programmes are available at official website www.dodldu.in. Learners are advised to go through the website for the respective syllabi and relevant provisions of the regulations.

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

Medium of instruction (Course Material and Counselling) for Undergraduate Programme shall be in Assamese only except for B.A. in English and B.Com Programme. However, a candidate may opt for Assamese or English for appearing in the examination for Under Graduate Programmes.

Medium of instruction (Course Materials and Counselling) and examination for the Post graduate programmes shall be English, except for M.A. Programme in Assamese.

STUDY MATERIALS

The Directorate has prepared all the study materials in the Self Learning Material (SLM) format in coordination with the course writers and editors as per UGC-ODL Regulations, 2020.

NOTE: However, it should be noted that the study materials supplied by the DODL, D.U. on different subjects represent the course materials. Further, Learners are advised to read the relevant reference books in order to acquire detailed knowledge of the subjects while preparing for examinations.



STUDENT SUPPORT SERVICES

PRE-ADMISSION COUNSELLING/ POST-ADMISSION COUNSELLING SESSIONS

The Directorate has a Pre-Admission Counselling Cell to guide Learners for the various issues related to admission procedures and options. After been admitted into a particular programme, the Directorate will organize a Learners' Meet before the onset of Counselling Sessions. The Directorate conducts weekend and weekdays Counselling for its learners. These counselling sessions can be availed by willing learners.

The Counselling Sessions for Undergraduate programmes shall be arranged by the Study Centres/LSCs and the coordinators will inform the schedules to the Learners enrolled at their respective Study Centres/LSCs.

RESEARCH AND MEDIA SUPPORT SERVICE

The Research and Media Support Service wing has been established with a twofold objective to facilitate in-house research in Distance Education as well as supplement the distance learners with multi-media facilities.

It includes information about the various events organized by the Directorate, assisting in administrative works, support with ICT tools etc.

Media Support Service provides supplementary support to the Distance Learners by -

- ▶ **Radio Programmes :** On every Thursday at 8 P.M., from All India Radio, Dibrugarh Centre, (M/W- 521.1)/ Radio Gyanmalinee FM 90.8
- ▶ **Multi-media CDs:** The Directorate has decided to provide its learners with course related Video CDs, which may give a good support to the learning process of the learners.
- ▶ **Bulk SMS:** To provide information regarding Counselling sessions, Assignments, Date and Results of Examination, other Administrative and Examination related information and so on. (if DO NOT DISTURB service is NOT activated in the contact numbers.

EDUCATION AND COMPUTER LABORATORY

The Directorate has developed one Computer and one Education Laboratory especially for the benefit of the distance learner. The Education Laboratory can only be availed by the DODL learners.

VIRTUAL CLASSROOM CUM E-LEARNING LAB

Overall structure of each programme as well as course related E-contents developed by experienced faculties will be available on DODL website for the benefit of the learners of DODL.

VIDEO CD

All the enrolled undergraduate Learners will be provided with a Video CD on each subject, which would provide them an overall idea of the whole course.

TEACHING AIDS

The directorate possesses a number of teaching aids (purchased from the DEC development grant) which are used in the personal contact programmes and the workshop held in the directorate. There are one LCD projector, one DLP projector, one portable overhead projector, five overhead projectors, one LCD TV with DTH connectivity and one public address system to be used as teaching aids.



PROGRAMME REGISTRATION

- ▶ A Student pursuing any programme of one year or longer duration offered by Directorate of Open and Distance Learning, Dibrugarh University may pursue any one Certificate Programme simultaneously.
- ▶ The candidates shall have to register themselves to the University at the time of admission clearly mentioning their course/subject combinations.
- ▶ The study Centres concerned shall submit to the University the detailed Registration List of their enrolled Learners along with the filled- in registration forms and the prescribed fees within one month from the date of admission or as prescribed in the University Academic Calendar.
- ▶ The Learners registered by the University as per the information provided by the study Centres shall be treated as final. In no circumstances, change of subject combination and switching from one core subject to another shall be allowed.

INFORMATION ON EXAMINATION AND EVALUATION

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMME:

- ▶ Examination and Evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis
- ▶ There shall be 20% marks for internal assessment (In Semester) and 80% marks for End Semester Examination in each course during every Semester.
- ▶ There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer – scripts of the End Semester Examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny.
- ▶ Internal assessment is assignment based.
- ▶ End Semester Examination:
 - (i) There shall be one End Semester Examination carrying 80% marks in each course of a Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the course. The End Semester Examination is normally a written / laboratory-based examination.
 - (ii) The Controller of Examinations shall then make necessary arrangements for notifying the dates of the End Semester Examinations and other procedures as per Dibrugarh University Rules (at least 20 days in advance) and the Academic Calendar / Date Sheet notified by the University / DODL, Dibrugarh University.
 - (iii) The End Semester Examination for each course shall be of three hours duration.
- ▶ Setting of question papers, moderation of question papers, evaluation of answer scripts, scrutiny, tabulation of marks etc. and announcement of result of results, shall be governed by the Dibrugarh University Examination Ordinance 1972 (as emended up to date).
- ▶ Betterment Examination:
 - (i) A learner shall be entitled to take the “Betterment Examination” in any two theory courses of any of the six semesters after passing the Sixth Semester Examination only once. In this case the higher marks secured by the student shall be retained. The learner shall have to apply for betterment examination within one year after passing the Sixth Semester Examination.
 - (ii) No betterment shall be allowed in the practical examination.
- ▶ A learner shall be declared as passed a course, provided he / she secures –
 - (i) at least 30% marks in the course in the End Semester Examination.
 - (ii) at least 30% marks in the course in aggregate in the In-and End-Semester Examination.



- A learner shall be declared as passed a Semester, provided he / she passes all the courses of a Semester independently.
- The marks of In – Semester Examinations (i.e., Internal Assessment) obtained by the learner shall be carried over for declaring any result.
- A learner who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of any End Semester Examinations up to Sixth Semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher Semester with the failed course(s) as carry over course(s). Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the carry over course in the next regular examinations of those courses. However, the following restrictions shall be applicable:
 - (i) A learner shall be entitled to avail the chance for a maximum of 6 consecutive years from the date of admission to clear a course or courses as well as the whole programme.
 - (ii) If a learner clears the Sixth Semester Examination before clearing all the courses of the previous semesters, the result of such candidate shall be kept withheld and his / her results shall be announced only after he / she clears the courses of the previous semesters.
- A learner must pass all his / her Semester Examinations within 6 years from the date of admission to the First Semester of any programme.
- A learner shall be declared to have passed the Six Semester Degree B.A. / B.Com. Programme provided he / she has passed all the Semesters and in all the course separately.
- The degrees shall be offered to each learner, who has passed the Sixth Semester Degree B.A. / B.Com. Programme in the following manner:

(iii) For any matter, other than these, the existing Dibrugarh University Rules, Ordinances and the Dibrugarh University Act, 1965 (as amended) shall be applied.



POST GRADUATE PROGRAMME

- ▶ Examination and Evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis
- ▶ There shall be 20% marks for internal assessment (In Semester) and 80% marks for End Semester Examination in each course during every Semester.
- ▶ There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer – scripts of the End Semester Examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re-scrutiny.
- ▶ Internal assessment is assignment based or OMR based.
- ▶ End Semester Examination:
 - (a) There shall be one End Semester Examination carrying 80% marks in each course of a Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the course. The End Semester Examination is normally a written / laboratory-based examination.
 - (b) The Controller of Examinations shall then make necessary arrangements for notifying the dates of the End Semester Examinations and other procedures as per Dibrugarh University Rules (at least 20 days in advance) and the Academic Calendar / Date Sheet notified by the University / DODL, Dibrugarh University.
 - (c) The End Semester Examination for each course shall be of three hours duration.
 - (d) Setting of question papers, moderation of question papers, evaluation of answer scripts, scrutiny, tabulation of marks etc. and announcement of result of results, shall be governed by the Dibrugarh University Examination Ordinance 1972 (as emended up to date).
- ▶ Betterment Examination:
 - (a) A learner shall be entitled to take the “Betterment Examination” in any two theory courses of any of the four semesters after passing the Fourth Semester Examination only once. In this case the higher marks secured by the student shall be retained. The learner shall have to apply for betterment examination within one year after passing the Fourth Semester Examination.
 - (b) No betterment shall be allowed in the practical examination.
- ▶ A learner shall be declared as passed a course, provided he / she secures –
 - At least 45% marks in the course (paper) in aggregate in the In-and End-Semester Examination.
- ▶ A learner shall be declared as passed a Semester, provided he / she passes all the courses of a Semester independently.
- ▶ The marks of In – Semester Examinations (i.e., Internal Assessment) obtained by the learner shall be carried over for declaring any result.
- ▶ A learner who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of any End Semester Examinations up to Fourth Semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher Semester with the failed course(s) as carry over course(s). Such learners will be eligible to appear in the carry over course in the next regular examinations of those courses. However, the following restrictions shall be applicable:
- ▶ “A learner shall be entitled to avail the chance for a maximum of 5 consecutive years from the date of admission to clear a course or courses as well as the whole programme”.
- ▶ If a learner clears the Fourth Semester Examination before clearing all the courses of the previous semesters, the result of such candidate shall be kept withheld and his / her results shall be announced only after he / she clears the courses of the previous semesters.



- A learner must pass all his / her Semester Examinations within 5 years from the date of admission to the First Semester of any programme.
- A learner shall be declared to have passed the Fourth Semester M.A. / M. Sc. / M. Com. Degree Programme provided he / she has passed all the Semesters and in all the course separately.
- The system of evaluation in DODL, D.U. is different from that of the Conventional Department of the University. It has a multi-tire system of evaluation:
 - (a) Self-assessment exercise within each unit of study.
 - (b) Continuous evaluation mainly through assignments and/or Internal Assessment Examination through Multiple Choice Questions (MCQ) using OMR sheet.
 - (c) Term-end examination.
 - (d) Project work (Programme specific)
- The marks secured by a student in the Assignment / IA – In Semester Examination (20% of each course) is added with the marks secured in that course in End Semester examination which is 80% of the course.
- The following scale of grading system shall be applied to indicate the performance of Learners in terms of letter grade and grade points as given below:

- The letter Grade 'B+' and above shall be considered First Class; the Letter Grade (s) 'B' to 'P' shall be considered as Second Class. However, letter Grade 'B' shall be considered as Second Class with minimum of 55% marks.
- A learner is considered to have completed a course successfully and earned Letter Grade other than 'F' (Failed) or Abs / I (Absent / Incomplete).
- If a learner secures 'F' Grade in a Course, he / she shall have to reappear in the Course in the next legitimate chance.
- Result of the learners appeared in the 'Betterment' examination shall not be counted for the award of Prizes / Medals / Rank or Distinction.
- A learner shall have to pay a prescribed fee to appear in the 'Betterment' Examination fixed by the University from time to time.



EXAMINATION CENTRE

The semester examinations for the Undergraduate and Postgraduate programmes under Directorate of Open and Distance Learning, Dibrugarh University will be held only in the selected Examination Centres located at different places. The examination centres will be allotted by the University on annual basis taking into consideration the distance and the size of enrolment of Learners.

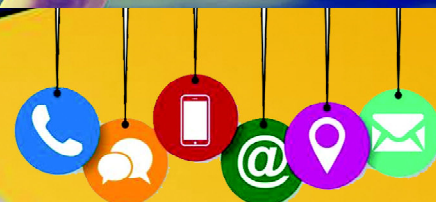
